National Service Scheme (NSS)

- ❖ **Wada & Talawli Village Adoption Project:**
- ❖ NSS Unit has been instrumental in adopting Villages and work for the upliftment of the villagers in Wada district. We have adopted 2 villages Sai Devli & Talavali for past 6-7 years. This year we have adopted one more village in Wada i.e. Vedhe, it is a small village in Wada district adopted jointly by Shri Satya Sai Seva organization and the NSS unit of our college. We carry out projects like Medical camp, survey, Bal-vikas, Ration distribution to the needy people etc. as well as various awareness activities are conducted by NSS volunteers regularly.
- ❖ **Tree Plantation at Ekta Ground:**

- ❖ Rakhi project was held between 1st Aug to 13th Aug 11. More than 80 volunteers sold gift articles like Rakhis, envelopes, purses, etc. prepared by mentally challenged children of Vallabhdas Dagra Indian Society for fund raising.
- ❖ **RRC Camp (Red Ribbon Club):**
- ❖ MDACS organized a training workshop for Red Ribbon Club volunteers at Wadala this year. The workshop was held from 19th July to 20th July 2011 & from 28th July to 29th July 2011. The motto for organizing this camp was to create awareness among the youths of college and training them to become peer educators for RRC activities. They gave proper knowledge to volunteers so that they may spread awareness about HIV/ AIDS and then its responsibility of volunteers to spread correct awareness about HIV & AIDS in our community.

Along with that they have been given relaxation in their attendance for the lectures and / or practicals as per the provision of the University norms. They are provided with the extra and remedial coaching, if required.

34. Students' achievements and awards:

- Miss. Anita Bhimrao Patil, T.Y. B.Sc PHYSICS student stood FIFTH RANK in The University of Mumbai and secured FIRST rank in the subject of PHYSICS at University level.

35. Guidance and counseling unit:

We provide services of professional counselors to the students. The activities include –

36. Placement services provided to the students:
